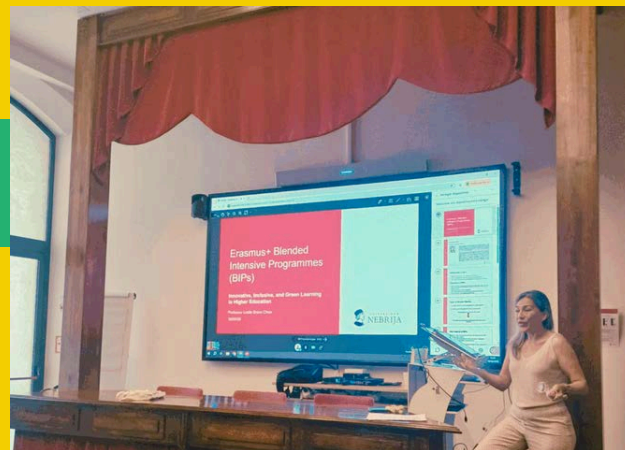
What has happened since our last newsletter?

Finalisation of the MICE Management Curriculum

Since the last update, we have finalised the MICE Management Curriculum. It consists of 16 modules, 8 of which are designed as micro-learning pills.

The curriculum:

- Develops MICE-related knowledge and cognitive skills
- Enhances operational and technical skills by advancing hands-on skills
- Fosters professional development and promotes continuous learning, preparing students to succeed in a global MICE environment.



Open Educational Resources and Narrative Scenarios

All partner universities has produced the Open Educational Resources (OERs) that support the MICENE curriculum. These materials include interactive, branching scenarios—stories that let students explore different outcomes depending on the choices they make. This format helps students experience real-life challenges from the MICE industry in the classroom.

Developing the MICENE Teaching Manual

The partnership has developed a teaching manual for educators to use the MICENE materials in their courses. It includes ideas for lessons, suggestions for combining online and in-person activities, and guidance on using scenario-based learning. The manual is meant to be practical and flexible, so it can be adapted to different teaching styles and contexts.

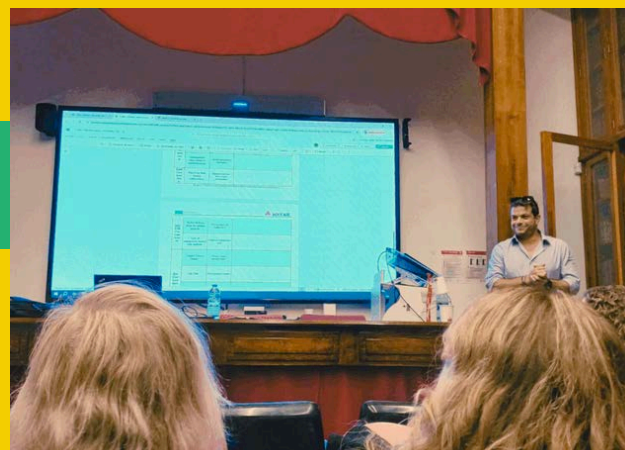


Mobility in Madrid: Sharing Best Practices

On 16-20 June, we organised a training week to pilot the teaching manual. It took place at Nebrija University, in Madrid, for 16 university professors. 8 professors attended in person and 8 joined online. The focus was on Work-Based Learning and Transformational Team Coaching. The group shared their own teaching experiences and explored new methods together. It was a great opportunity to connect, learn, and prepare for piloting the MICE.N.E. MICE Management Curriculum.



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What's next?

Project partners are now preparing the pilot phase of MICE.N.E.:

- The MICE Management Curriculum will be piloted with 80 students in 4 countries
- The students will work on real-life challenges from 8 companies
- The most successful team will be invited to present their case study at the MICENE Final Conference in December, hosted by University of Naples Federico II.
